1. The Glory of Moses on Mt. Sinai

● ²⁹ When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the LORD. ³⁰ When



Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. ³² Afterward all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the LORD had given him on Mount Sinai.

³³ When Moses finished speaking to them, he put a veil over his face. ³⁴ But whenever he entered the LORD’s presence to speak with him, he removed the veil until he came out. And when he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵ they saw that his face was radiant. Then Moses would put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with the LORD.

—Numbers 34:29-35, *New International Version*

● ¹² Therefore, since we have such hope, we use great boldness of speech— ¹³ unlike Moses, *who* put a veil over his face so that the children of Israel could not look steadily at the end of what was passing away.

¹⁴ But their minds were blinded. For until this day the same veil remains unlifted in the reading of the Old Testament, because the *veil* is taken away in [the Messiah]. ¹⁵ But even to this day, when Moses is read, a veil lies on their heart.

—2 Corinthians 3:12-16, *New King James Version*

2. The Glory of Yeshua (Jesus) on a Mountain

● ²⁸ About eight days after Jesus said these things, he took Peter, John, and James and went up on a mountain to pray. ²⁹ While Jesus was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became shining white.

● ¹⁵ “The Lord your God will give you a man who speaks for God like me from among your own brothers. You must listen to him. ¹⁶ This is what you asked of the Lord your God at Sinai on the day of the meeting, when you said, ‘Do not let me hear the voice of the Lord my God again. Do not let me see this fire any more, or I will die.’ ¹⁷ And the Lord said to me, ‘They have spoken well. ¹⁸ I will give them a man who speaks for God like you from among their brothers. I will put My

words in his mouth. And he will make known to them all that I tell him.

3. The Glory of Believers Operating in Power

● ⁵ For what we are proclaiming is not ourselves, but the Messiah Yeshua as Lord, with ourselves as slaves for you because of Yeshua. ⁶ For it is the God who once said, “Let light shine out



of darkness,” who has made his light shine in our hearts, the light of the knowledge of God’s glory shining in the face of the Messiah Yeshua.

● ¹² Then spoke Jesus again unto them, saying, “I am the Light of the world. He that followeth Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.”

4. The Glory of Heaven—The Perfect Day!

INTRODUCTION:

If we were to compare King Solomon to Moses, who would you say was the brightest of the two?

No, wasn't King Solomon. It was Moses.

King Solomon didn't meet the criteria for two reasons.

1. He might have been the wisest man who ever lived, he might have even been wiser than Moses, but he certainly wasn't brighter than Moses because his heart departed from the Lord in his latter years.

2. King Solomon's face didn't shine like Moses' face because he never got into God's presence like Moses did.

There is something about being in the presence of God. It isn't like being in the presence of great people. Even other believers can't bring us that level. Only intimacy with God make us shine.

It works like this: When we have God inside of us, he will shine through us. We might not even realize it when we are shining with the glory of God, but others will notice it.

Today there is a move within many Christian circles to get the actual, physical glory of God upon our lives. Some believers have even been reported to shine with gold dust! I think that's wonderful, if it's real! I'm all for it, if it is genuine. But let's not do it with fake glitter.

Accept no substitutes! Climb that mountain! Stay in God's presence! And come back down to planet earth and **go light your world!**

CONCLUSION:

The World's Brightest Man was and is the Messiah Yeshua (Jesus). His glory lights up heaven. So if you want the light of the Messiah in your life, both now and in the life to come, then please pray this prayer with me:
